RESPONDING TO A NATURAL GAS LEAK: Knowing how to recognize, react, and report natural gas emergencies can help keep you and your community safe.

If you smell

ROTTEN EGGS

it could be a gas leak.

RECOGNIZE signs of a natural gas leak may include:

- A "rotten egg" smell
- Blowing or hissing sound
- Dead or discolored vegetation in an otherwise green area
- Dirt or dust blowing from a hole in the ground
- Bubbling in wet or flooded areas
- Flames, if a leak has ignited

REACT

- Leave the area immediately, without using anything that could ignite the natural gas
- Do not use any electrical device, such as light switches, telephones / cell phones or garage door openers
- Do not use an open flame, matches, or lighters
- Do not try to locate the source of the gas leak
- Do not try to shut off any natural gas valves or gas appliances
- Do not start vehicles
- Do not re-enter the building or return to the area until our employees say it is safe


RESPOND

THEFT AND VANDALISM HURTS US ALL: Everyone pays the price of natural gas theft and the vandalism of natural gas facilities.

If you see damaged natural gas equipment or someone acting suspiciously near it, please report it to Fountaintown Gas as soon as possible at (765)763-6393 or if afterhours at (833)763-6393.

REMINDER: The theft of natural gas and the tampering with metering equipment is a crime and will be reported to the authorities.
